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Gilded Age responses to industrialization:

- ∼laissez-faire capitalism and social Darwinism
- ~socialism and anarchism
- ~Populism
- **∼**Unionism



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The Progressive concensus:

- working class
- ~middle class
- ~upper class



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Key Progressive ideas:

- ~rejection of social Darwinism
 - cooperation instead of competition
 - human agency produces progress
 - civic activism required when power is too concentrated



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Key Progressive ideas (con't):

- ~rejection of formalism
 - ~economic realism
 - ∼legal realism
 - ~pragmatism
- ~social Gospel
 - morality requires social justice
 - ~churches should help solve society's problems
- ~scientific management
 - collect data & analyze it rationally
 - ∼legislate change



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Main areas of Progressive reform:

- ~political reform
 - ~city government
 - ~direct election
 - ~recall & referendum
 - ~women's suffrage
- ~economic reform
 - ~regulate competition
 - ∼regulate worker safety
 - ∼regulate consumer safety
 - ~conservation



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Main areas of Progressive reform (con't):

- ~social reform
 - ~settlement houses
 - housing and public health
 - ∼birth control
- ~moral reform
 - ~prohibition
